PKI

- Changed extracting certificate from HTTP header to conform with the new default behaviour of how NGINX escapes the certificate

Keycloak SPI Providers

- When converting certificates to tokens non-human attributes like IMO number, etc., are now also added to token
- Align extracting certificate from HTTP header to conform with how NGINX escapes certificates
 - All occurrences of `$ssl_client_cert` in NGINX config should be replaced with `$ssl_client_escaped_cert`

Identity Registry

- Made issue certificates with server generated key pairs an optional feature which is disabled by default
- Align extracting certificate from HTTP header to conform with how NGINX escapes certificates
 - All occurrences of `$ssl_client_cert` in NGINX config should be replaced with `$ssl_client_escaped_cert`
- The role of any non-human entity now always defaults to the lowest possible role

Portal

- Implemented functionality for generating certificate signing requests which are then used to get certificates from the MIR
 - Implemented optional generation of a PKCS#12 keystore based on the issued certificate
- When issuing a new certificate for an entity the user is given a choice of whether to use the above mentioned features for getting the certificate or to use the “old” method of letting the ID registry generate the key pair and certificate

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- Fixed bug where closing a modal dialogue would not act as expected
